ABDE 21 days of prayer and fasting



JOHN 15: 1-17 (NKJV)

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.

Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit. You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you.

Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered; and they gather them and throw them into the fire, and they are burned.

If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples.

As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love.

If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love.

These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full. This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. You are My friends if you do whatever I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you.

You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.

These things I command you, that you love one another."

Welcome

We are excited to enter into these next 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting!

You may be wondering why we are doing this at the start of a new year:

It's our desire that the next 21 days will prepare our hearts for what the Lord wants to do in and through us in 2025. But, most importantly, we long to live out the teaching of John 15:1-17 - to abide in Christ: to continually draw closer to Him and to know His presence with us.

Each day of this guide contains a prayer focus. This includes one or two Scriptures to reflect on along with some prayer points. This year, there is a daily Scripture reading guide that will help us reflect more intentionally on God's Word in a step-by-step pattern (see page 6).

Please note that these prayer points are only suggestions and so feel free to pray into each area as the Holy Spirit leads you. All we ask is that you take time each day to pray for the theme that's given.

If fasting is a new concept to you – don't worry! We will take plenty of time to explain what it's all about during our Sunday gatherings and a fasting guide will be made available in the foyer.

As we begin this journey, you may see things change instantly, you may not. However, be encouraged! God is at work in you and your world. Jeremiah 29:13 tells us that when we seek the Lord with all of our hearts – we'll find Him.

So let's begin!

DAILY

WEEKLY

FASTING

What is fasting? As Christians, fasting is to abstain from something so that we can better devote ourselves to seek God in prayer.

Even the Lord Jesus took time to fast and pray (Luke 4:1, John 4:31-34) and spoke of it as something that was expected (Matthew 6:17-19).

Fasting will look different for everyone, some examples include: a meat free diet, coffee, sugars, TV/streaming, social media etc.

There are many options!

Why do we fast?

Scripture teaches us that prayer with fasting and meditating on God's Word will strengthen our faith and trust in Him. The Bible also teaches us that God will renew and build us up spiritually during a fast and that some things will only change through prayer and fasting (see Mark 9:29).

In many respects, fasting is ultimately when we surrender ourselves to God, steer ourselves with determination to do God's will and discern His voice.

We would love everyone to consider fasting something during these 21 days. For more information on fasting, please pick up a guide from the Church foyer.

DAILY SCRIPTURE REFLECTION GUIDE

Each day of our prayer and fasting journey, there will be a Scripture to read and reflect upon. Below are steps to guide us as we meditate on God's Word – simply turn back to this page each day and follow the four steps. What better way to abide in Christ than to abide in His Word every day?

- 1. Read: This is where we begin. We read (or listen) to the Scripture slowly, savouring each word like a delicious meal. We approach the text with reverence and anticipation, allowing the words to sink deep into our souls.
- **2. Meditate (reflect):** After reading, we pause to reflect on what we've read. We ponder the words, turning them over in our minds like a precious gem, examining them from every angle.

To help with meditation, feel free to use some of these questions to guide your thoughts: copy and paste in from Bible plan.

- **3. Pray:** As we meditate on the Scripture, it naturally leads us into prayer. We speak to God about what we've read, asking for insight, confessing our shortcomings, or expressing gratitude.
- **4. Contemplate:** Finally, we rest in God's presence, allowing the truth we've encountered to penetrate our hearts fully. Why not take a moment to note down anything that has stood out to you from God's Word.

DAY 1 | SACRIFICE

Monday 13th January

Hopefully you have chosen something to fast from as we begin our 21 day journey. As we make sacrifices to spend more time pursuing Christ, it is a good time to reflect on His ultimate sacrifice on the cross. Christ died for our sins and loved us enough to sacrifice His life for humankind. We too, can take a lesson from this as we prepare to make sacrifices to focus on Christ through prayer and fasting.

Today's Scripture | Romans 12:1

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship."

Today's Prayer Prompts

Thanking God for the ultimate sacrifice of His Son on the cross and therefore the gift of having our sins forgiven and eternal life

A closer relationship with the Lord during our 21 day journey

DAY 2 | GRATITUDE

Tuesday 14th January

The Apostle Paul often emphasised the importance of an attitude of gratitude in our prayers. In fact, gratitude can often change our outlook on many things in life, and as Christians, there's always something to be thankful for!

Indeed, C.S. Lewis (writer of the Chronicles of Narnia) distinguishes between gratitude and adoration - employing the use of a rare word "coruscations" (which means a flash of light or brilliance). He writes:

"Gratitude exclaims, very properly, 'How good of God to give me this.' Adoration says, 'What must be the quality of that Being [God] whose far-off and momentary coruscations are like this!' One's mind runs back up the sunbeam to the sun."

In other words, C.S. Lewis encourages us to not only be grateful for all that God has done (and is doing) in our lives – but to turn this back to Him in praise and adoration!

Today's Scripture | 1 Thessalonians 5:16-28

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

As Christians, our relationships matter – whether among friends, family, spouses or with one another as followers of Jesus. Today, let's pray for a greater God-given love and unity in our congregation.

Today's Scriptures

1 Corinthians 13:4-8

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away."

John 13:34

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

DAY 5 | HEALTH AND HEALING

Friday 17th January

Healing can be a difficult topic, especially when we or those we love have suffered pain and loss. As Christians, we hold to these three truths: firstly, God can (and does) heal today. Secondly, God may not always heal on this side of eternity. Yet thirdly, and most importantly - full healing from all sickness, death and mourning will come when Christ returns to rule and reign.

As Revelation 21:4 says, a day will come when Jesus, "will wipe every tear... There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." And so, because we know how the story ends – we can be confident in our God who is always good (even when our circumstances are far from good). With this in mind, let's pray boldly for the many forms of healing that the Lord can bring into our lives.

Today's Scripture | Isaiah 43:1-2

"But now, O Jacob, listen to the Lord who created you. O Israel, the one who formed you says, "Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine. When you go through deep waters, I will be with you. When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown. When you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you."

DAY 18 | CURRENT EVENTS

Thursday 30th January

It only takes a glance at the news/current events to see the impact of sin and humanity's brokenness on our world. From wars to political tension and economic downturns to environmental disasters – the constant narrative of chaos and crisis can be overwhelming.

And yet, we can lift our eyes to Jesus, our Prince of Peace, who when everything around us is shaking remains our rock of ages – unshakable. In the storms, He is our anchor – as the old Boys Brigade hymn goes:

> We have an anchor that keeps the soul, Steadfast and sure while the billows roll; fastened to the Rock which cannot move, grounded firm and deep in the Saviour's love!

Today we can respond in two ways to the current events in our world. Firstly, we can reflect on God's Word: our hope is ultimately in Christ who will wipe away the current broken order of the world to make "all things new" (Revelation 21:5). Secondly, we can intercede on behalf of people, circumstances and nations.

Today's Scripture | Romans 5:3-5

"We can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they help us develop endurance. And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens our confident hope of salvation. And this hope will not lead to disappointment. For we know how dearly God loves us, because he has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with his love."

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."
